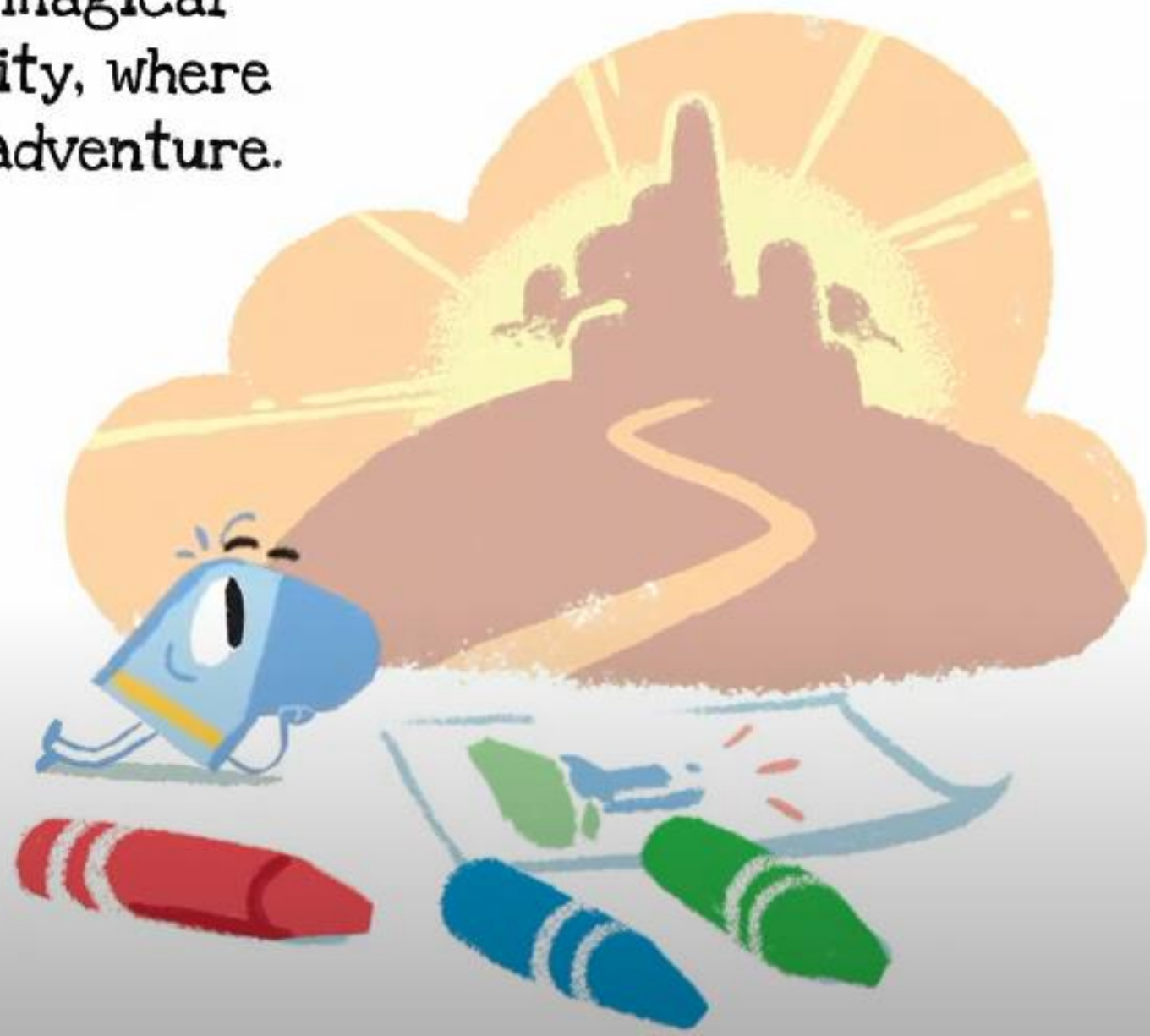



All the other socks seem happy,

something different.



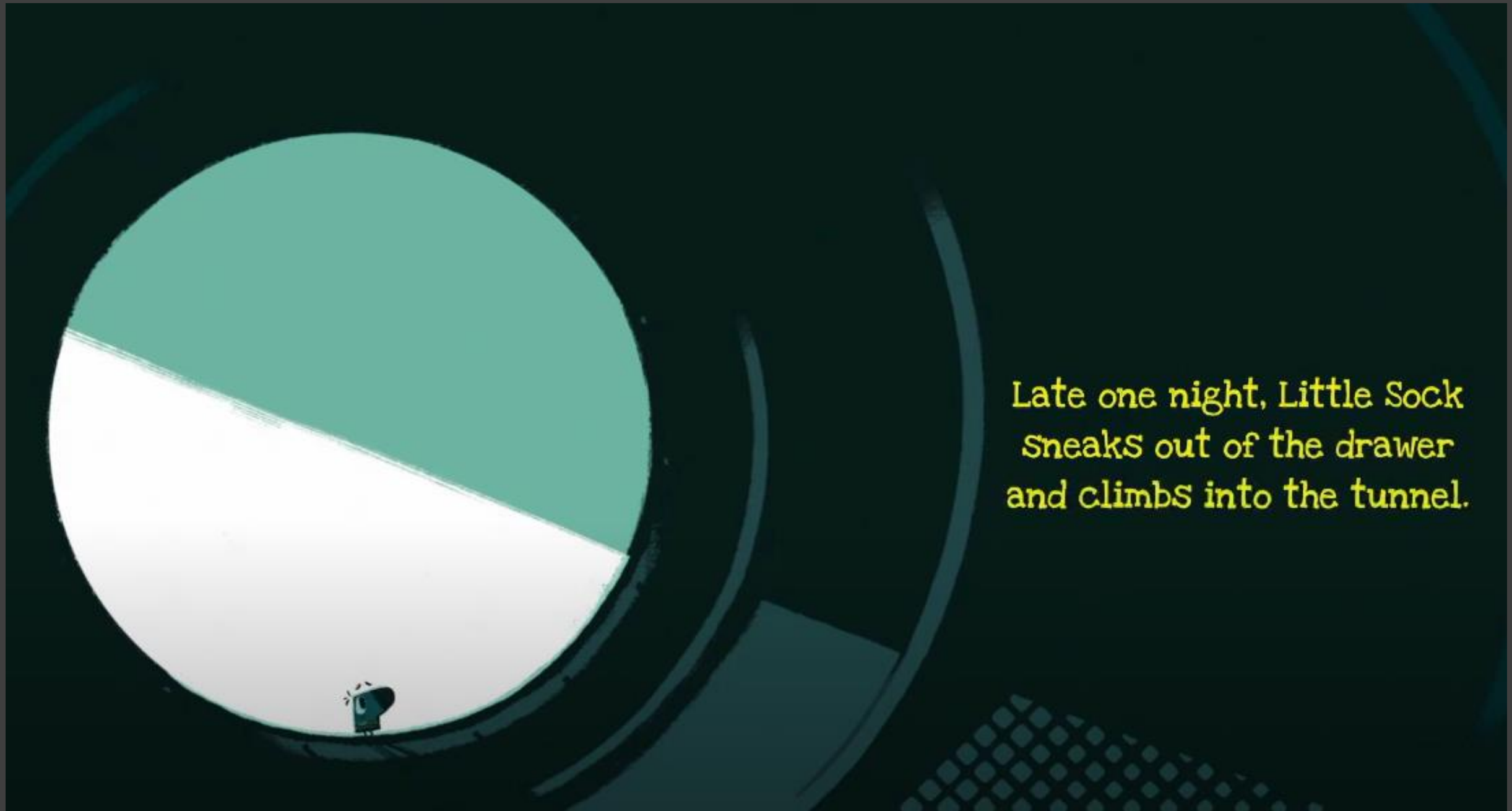


He has heard of a magical

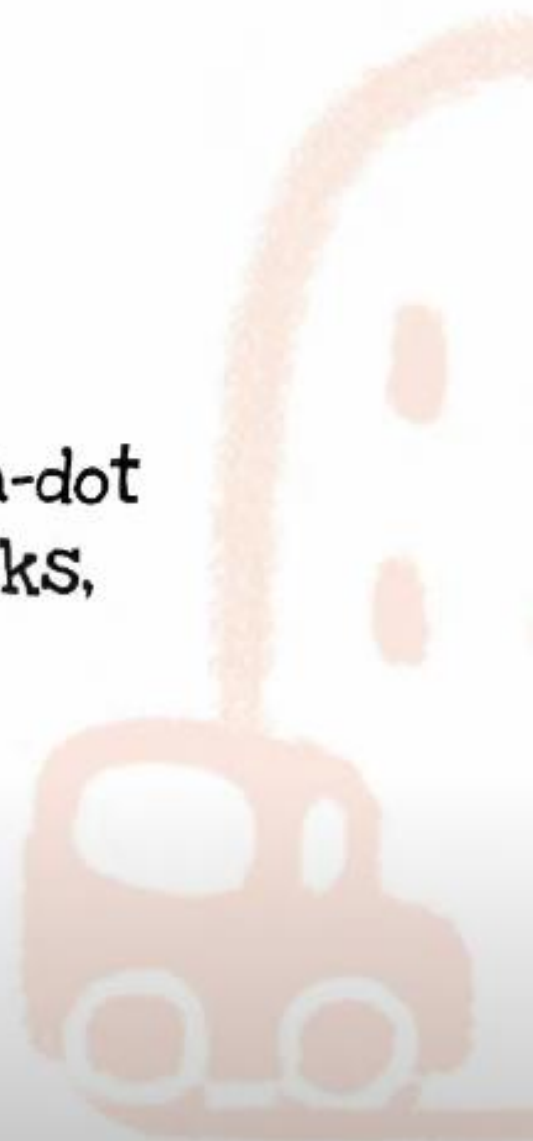
